

## The International Exchange Student Program

- In order to be accepted as an international exchange student at CCU, the applicants must be enrolled at one of our partner universities and are **nominated by home university**.
- If home university has no exchange agreement with CCU, students may also apply as a fee-paying visiting student, and they will be charged for tuition fee during their study at CCU.

### Courses for international exchange students

Student can choose one of the following programs:

| <b>Mandarin Taught Program</b> | All inbound international exchange students are qualified to apply for our free Mandarin Courses for their language skills purposes. | Most CCU courses are taught in Chinese. With dozens of free Mandarin courses offered on semester base on campus, we also offer free cultural experience courses for inbound international exchange students to get a taste of the beauty of Chinese Culture but also aim at acquiring the proficiency of Mandarin language during their stay at CCU. |
| <b>English Taught Program</b>  |  | Inbound exchange students who are less Mandarin-driven may adopt this English program in the Department of Global Business (College of International Studies and Foreign Languages). They may acquire academic knowledge regarding the subject of business, instead.   |

### **Nomination deadline for CCU inbound international exchange program**

The program is available for one academic year (September to next June) or one semester (September to January or February to June). The deadlines are as follows:

## VISA & Alien Residence Certificate (ARC)

- Resident Visa & Visitor Visa

| <p><b>One-academic-year exchange students</b></p>  | <p><b>Apply for resident visa</b></p> | <p>Resident Visa holders are required to apply for the Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) at local service centers of the National Immigration Agency within 15 days starting from the next day of their arrival. They may stay in Taiwan (R.O.C.) as long as the Alien Resident Certificate remains valid.</p> |
| <p><b>One-semester exchange students</b></p>   | <p><b>Apply for visitor visa</b></p>  | <p>Visitor Visa holders should apply for the extension within 15 days before the expiry date of their visitor visa.</p>   |
| <p>*Visitor Visa holders who are permitted to stay in Taiwan (R.O.C.) for sixty or ninety days and whose visas bear no such remark as "no extension will be granted" may apply at local service centers of the <b>National Immigration Agency</b> for a maximum of 120 or 90 days of extensions.</p> |                                       |   |

Required Documents for Applying for a Resident Visa:

- **Please note:**

| <b>1</b> | One-semester exchange students must apply for Taiwan (R.O.C.) student visa and extend visa before it is expired.  |
| <b>2</b> | As for one-year exchange students, we strongly recommend students obtain a resident visa prior to entering Taiwan (R.O.C.) because only a resident visa holder can apply for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC). |
| <b>3</b> | Please <b>DO NOT</b> use the landing visa to enter Taiwan (R.O.C.). If so, students will need to leave from Taiwan (R.O.C.) and apply for a new visa.   |

- **Health Examination**

| <b>One-academic-year exchange students</b> | One-academic-year exchange students are required to bring their copy of the health examination certificate that is used to apply for a resident visa. |
| <b>One-semester exchange students</b>      | One-semester exchange students are required to submit the health examination certificate to CCU.  |

## Dormitories

| Building                        | Cost per semester | Check-in Deposit |

\*At CCU, dormitories are non-coed, furnished WITHOUT mattress or bedding, and are equipped with laundry facilities. CCU offers the bed sheet and mattress ordering service if needed.

**\*NOTE: Cooking is strictly prohibited in CCU dormitories.**

\*The dormitory fee might be adjusted every year.

\*Residence halls remain open for students during summer and winter vacation. Residents may apply at their own costs.

**\*International exchange students that live in the dormitory must follow the student's dorm regulations.**
